
Dear Parents and Guardians,


We know that our difference is the confidence we instil in our girls, so they become fiercely independent. This stems from an all-girls and an all-through (Prep into Senior School) education. It is the key to our success.

Year 5 is a step up in terms of independence, responsibility and organisation it is all about our girls stepping up to their full potential and becoming role models for the younger girls. Leadership opportunities abound for girls in Year 6, with all the girls allocated to a particular position of responsibility in the Prep School. Year 5 girls attend an outdoor education trip at Bowles, near Tunbridge Wells, as well as Year 6 participating in week's residential trip at Marchants Hill focusing on transition skills. Their confidence in themselves and their learning blossoms, and they are ready to step forward into the next phase of their school lives. When girls enter Year 6, they have 30% of their lessons in Senior School with Senior School teachers, in what is an immersive transition year, in readiness for the step from Prep into Senior School the following year.

Whenever your daughter joins our Prep School, she is made to feel welcome instantly. The move from a Junior School into Year 7 is a big one, and can be a challenging one. We ensure the move from our Prep School into our Senior School is positive and seamless both academically and pastorally.

I look forward to welcoming you to our school, so you can discover our difference.








Our girls do better because they feel better

For our Year 5 to Year 6 girls Personal Development continues to have a daily focus in Brains Matter. The aim of this is for each girl to identify how she is feeling, using the emotional barometer, and to learn the strategies required to cope with big feelings as well as small feelings. With the support of her Form teacher, along with the guidance of our Director of Pastoral Care or School Counsellor, she will do better because she feels better. She will learn the strategies to become fearless, to have the courage to try new things and to have no boundaries to her future opportunities.



Step into our curriculum

Confidence and challenge

Our aim is for the girls to experience an academically challenging curriculum but in an environment which is a 'greenhouse' rather than a 'hot house'. Individual iPads from Year 4, provided by the school, support independent and collaborative learning and the girls see these devices as part of their 'learning' toolkit.

In Year 3 to Year 6, your daughter will continue to experience the nurturing support of her Form Tutor but begin the transition into Year 7 by having an increasing number of specialist teachers in Senior School laboratories and specialist rooms. By Year 6, many of her lessons will be in Senior School: Art, Computing, Design and Technology, PE and Science. Our girls are extended through challenge opportunities. In a number of lessons a Learning Support teacher works within the classroom as well as providing prior learning opportunities and activities to develop girls' memory skills. The girls learn 'how to learn'.



- In **English lessons**, the girls study high quality texts, which form the basis of their learning adventure each term. Example themes include: "Boomerangs and Billabongs" and 'Land of the Free". There is a focus on developing comprehension skills and the application of taught grammar skills in their creative writing. They learn how to debate, how to write explanation texts along with creative poetry and narratives. They become authors. The girls have the opportunity to enter both the GDST Writing and Poetry competitions and to enter pieces of work for the school magazine.
- In **Mathematics** lessons, the girls apply the skills they have learnt to more advanced problem solving, to become confident mathematicians. They enter the *UK Mathematics Challenge* competition, and in Year 6 they experience the excitement of *Maths in Motion*.
- Our **Scientists** of the future are given endless opportunities. They dissect a pig's heart, if they would like to, perform experiments in **Senior School** laboratories
- History and Geography lessons inspire the girls, frequently accompanied by a school trip. They embrace technology and explore WebQuests and present their research findings.
- The teaching of the **Arts** continues to be highly valued at Sutton High School, with stunning concerts in our state-of-the-art **Lees Hall**. Girls can have individual instrumental lessons, all learn how to read music and play the keyboard and there is weekly orchestra and choir. The can elect to participate in a Drama club and take the LAMDA examination. There are plays for Year 4 and Year 6 girls, a highlight of the Prep School year.
- **PE** is taught by specialists and the superb facilities, including an indoor swimming pool and full-sized sports hall means a high level of skill can be achieved. There are numerous fixtures and Trust Rallies which develop sporting skills as well as attributes such as collaboration and team work.
- Our specialist teaching in **Computing**, in the Senior School Computer Science Lab, allows girls to develop skills in coding, problem-solving and robotics.

Progress tests and Scholarships

It is the progress your daughter makes which we value and celebrate, helping her to achieve the best version of herself. For example, in tests Year 3 to Year 6 girls will learn how to revise, how to prepare for tests, so they are not overwhelmed and cope with the situation. They are supported to look at their results, they will not receive a score on a paper initially, so they focus on areas to develop rather than comparing themselves with others. You will be provided with regular feedback in Parents' Evenings and School Reports, along with meetings as required.



11+ Examination

Our girls are awarded a place into Senior School from Year 3, no need to take our 11+.

We prepare our girls for the scholarship tests and at Year 6 and many are successful. This is achieved in an environment which is not a 'hot house'. Girls complete weekly verbal and non-verbal reasoning lessons from Year 3.




Breathe the Wild Air Learning beyond the classroom

Day Trips

The Prep girls frequently have educational visits. For example, to further their scientific curiosity there have been visits to Greenwich Observatory, Royal Institute, Bay Pond, Nower Wood. Our Year 5 girls take to the stage at the Globe Theatre, become astronomers at Greenwich Observatory. Our Year 6 girls support our local community and sing at the Salvation Army, and Remembrance Day in Sutton town centre.

Residential Trips

- Year 4 with the nurturing environment of Sayers Croft, two nights away means the girls can have their own adventures to share with their families on return.
- Year 5 Bowles, enhances a love of the outdoors. The girls develop resilience and learn independence, including how to pack for themselves and to carry their own suitcase!
- Year 6 Marchants Hill, they learn more about themselves through a transition programme, challenge themselves (the zip wire or giant swing will do that to the best of us!) and they continued to learn the value of friends and team work.
