

303b PS CAREERS EDUCATION AND GUIDANCE POLICY

Careers education in the Prep School is a part of the broad and balanced curriculum provided by the school.

Aims

Careers education in Prep School seeks to:

- provide an opportunity for girls to develop self-awareness (being aware of their strengths and weaknesses)
- provide information on the wide range of careers and opportunities that are available to them
- help pupils understand links between their learning

Delivery of Careers Education in the Prep School

The majority of the careers education in Prep School is taught through PSHE lessons as part of the 'Money and Work' strand.

Workshops are held at various times during the school year where pupils are exposed to people in different lines of work. For example, the Metropolitan Police, the London Fire Service, a Head of Data and chief architect have been invited in to talk to the girls in different year groups. EYFS have visits from a doctor, dentist and vet as part of their Superhero Friends topic.

School trips are also an opportunity for girls to broaden their knowledge on different careers.

Parents are invited in from time to time, either in school or online via Teams, to talk about their places of work and what their jobs entail.

Monitoring and Evaluation

The Assistant Head - Pastoral is responsible for the monitoring and evaluation of careers education throughout the Prep School. Planning is monitored to ensure that career education is taking place in the classrooms.
